Community Passion for Independent, Experimental and Budding Filmmakers Finds a New Home at ARTSPLACE

ANNAPOLIS ROYAL, Nova Scotia (JUNE 23, 2021) – ARTSPLACE and the former King's Film Society have jointly celebrated cinema through community screenings, film talks, and outdoor movies over the past five years. From a presentation of "Evangeline," filmed at Fort Anne in 1913; and films exploring local First Nation's culture; to the annual "Teen Instagram Film Festival", showcasing budding high-school filmmakers; this partnership has directed dynamic and diverse programming for the Western Annapolis Valley.

"Joining forces and combining resources means ARTSPLACE will continue to program events like Dave Dyment's video art feature "Timeline" plus family Movie Nights like "The Muppet Movie" at Oqwa'titek Amphitheatre (the "O") to honour the Film Society's 28-year legacy of celebrating cinema as art and entertainment in our region" said Gallery Director, Sophie Paskins.

"We're very excited that the best aspects of our co-operation will continue in programming that features more intimate screenings, a Q&A with filmmakers, and even more outdoor events." added Ted Lind, ARTSPLACE Board Member and Program Committee Chair.

The first outdoor presentation at OpenSpace Film takes place Friday July 23, 2021 (rain date: July 30) with a series of short films by the award-winning filmmaker Casimir Nozkowski. Nozkowski's work has been featured on The Tonight Show, PBS, MSNBC, cited in the New York Times and his films have been shown at the MOMA (Museum of Modern Art).

This program is a testament to Nozkowski's sensitive and wry observations: "...you're just living your life and forget the kind of interesting things that are happening around you and all the real life that's happening around you."

"These films will make you laugh, and cry with their humanity. Bring your own seating, your friends, refreshments of your choosing and get ready for films at twilight!" added Lind.
